Basic question

- Defines what problem or challenge must be resolved to deliver impact.
- The question should be SMART (see next page)

Context/rationale for project:

- Sets out the situation and complication
- Explains relevant background and why solving the problem matters
- Covers prior efforts to address the problem

Impact metrics/goals/timing:

- Explains how you will know you have succeeded
- Considers whose views should be accounted for
- Lists qualitative and quantitative metrics with associated goals, linked to the basic question; metrics should be possible to track and SMART (see next page)
- Examples of metrics: patient and staff experience, clinical outcomes, financial savings, service growth, workforce feedback, commissioner feedback

Sources of Insight

 Identifies where relevant expertise, knowledge, and approaches exist, both within the organisation and outside the organisation

In scope/ out of scope

- Indicates what the problem solving will and will not include
- Defines limits of the set of solutions to consider

Risks and barriers

- Identifies risks/barriers specific to the project
- Can include mitigating actions to address risks

Main stakeholders

- Identifies specific individuals or groups who are important to engage in the project
 - Who makes the decisions
 - Who could support (or derail) the project
 - Who ought to be invited to be part of the extended project team
